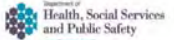

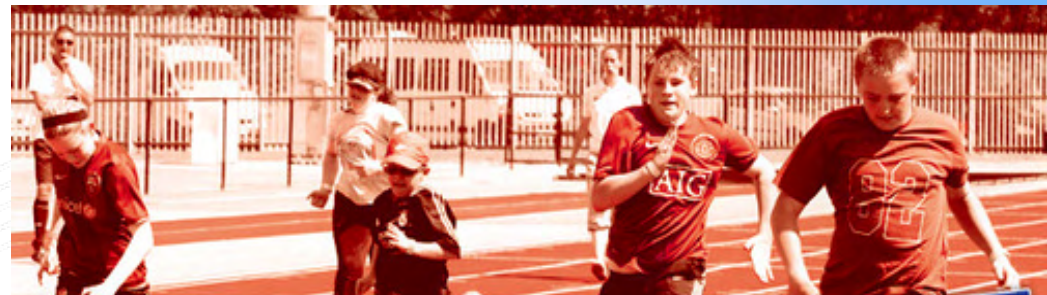

Humber Safeguarding through Sport Group

The Humber Safeguarding through Sport group has representation from the four local authorities across the Humber sub-region as well as:

- Local Safeguarding Children Board representative
- Yorkshire and Humber Regional Manager from English Gymnastics
- The Goodwin Development Trust Child Protection Manager
- East Riding County FA Welfare Officer
- Lincolnshire County Welfare Officer

The group also has strong links to the Child Protection in Sport Unit (CPSU) through their National Development Officer - Nick Slinn. The terms of reference for the group are attached here.
