What is the NSPCC Young People's Board for Change?

The Young People's Board for Change are a diverse group of 15 young people from across the UK. They share their views and ideas to advise the NSPCC on what matters most to children and young people. They get involved in lots of fun projects and get the opportunity to travel across the country to take part in residentials, meetings, and workshops.

If I become a member, what am I signing up to?

As a member you will:

- Attend monthly sessions and workshops with the rest of the Young People's Board for Change.
- Be trained to develop lots of important skills like campaigning, public speaking and more.
- Share your views and ideas with key decision makers at the NSPCC, like our trustees and other staff
- Work with our national and regional campaigns teams to campaign for change.
- Work with the rest of the Young People's Board for Change to champion young people's views throughout the work of NSPCC.
- Take action on topics that matter to you — this will involve meeting and working together in smaller groups, and working with other young people who are not on the board to find out what their views are.
- Represent the Young People's Board for Change at exciting events.

As a member, you need to be:

- Committed to being a member of the Young People's Board for Change for two years, from January 2021 – January 2023.
- Available to consistently attend all online and face-to-face meetings (including up to three weekend or half-term residentials each year).
- Happy to share your views and ideas, and to tell the NSPCC what you think about what they do, and what they could be doing better for children and young people.
- Excited to work in a team with a group of 15 other young people from across the UK.
- Willing to listen to others and respect views that might be different to your own.
- Ready to try new things and take part in new experiences, like attending meetings with decision-makers at the NSPCC.
- Interested in finding out what other young people in your area and across the country think, and work together with the rest of the Young People's Board for Change to do this.

This might sound really exciting, but might also involve lots of new things that you haven't done before – that is totally OK! There will be lots of fun training sessions and workshops to support you to learn new things, and develop your confidence along the way. Plus, our friendly Participation Team are here to support you through every step of your journey so that you feel confident and ready to be heard!

What does it cost?

It doesn't cost anything to join. The NSPCC will cover the cost of travel, accommodation and other expenses like food when you come to any in-person events and meetings. All of these details will be shared with you and your parent/carer before any meetings or events.
