Have you got what it takes to join our fight for childhood?

Abuse ruins childhood, but it can be prevented. That's why NSPCC is here. That's what drives all our work, and that's why - as long as there's abuse - we will fight for every childhood.

In over 40 service centres around the UK we work directly with children and families on a range of issues. We support parents and families in caring for their children, we provide therapeutic services to help children move on from abuse and we help professionals make the best decisions for children, across the UK.

Sometimes it's not possible for a vulnerable child, a family or a young person to make their way to one of our service centres. Our volunteer drivers are therefore crucial in helping to ensure that our national service continues to be delivered to those who need it.

Our volunteer drivers help the NSPCC to transform the lives of children, young people and families and play a key role in supporting them to access vital services they might not otherwise be able to reach.

We are looking for enthusiastic, reliable and committed people who can provide a sense of security to our children and young people whilst travelling to and from their sessions with us.

We're looking for committed people who:

- ✓ Hold a current Driving License and own car
- ✓ Up to date and adequate motor insurance
- ✓ Have good communication and time-keeping skills
- ✓ Be available to work at agreed times during the day
- ✓ Have a warm-non-judgemental approach to children and families
- ✓ Have no criminal convictions against children or offences of violence

We provide every volunteer with training and ongoing support:

All volunteers will take part in a 10 hour training programme which includes Health & Safety and Child Protection training. Volunteers will also receive support through regular supervisions.

There will be opportunities to attend social events and be recognised for your contributions. You will receive out of pocket travel expenses (car mileage, bus or train) in line with NSPCC's expense policy.

Necessary enhanced background checks and references:

A satisfactory enhanced criminal record check is a requirement for the role, before progressing to training across the four nations (Access N.I., the Protecting Vulnerable Groups Scheme (PVG), Enhanced DBS check). We ask our volunteers to provide all relevant identity and right to work in the UK documents at interview. While volunteering, a re-check must be processed when validity has elapsed. At least two satisfactory references covering a minimum period of 5 years with no gaps is required, one of which must not be from a partner or family member.
